# FROM THE RABBI

### Repentance—Where Should We Concentrate

As we approach the High Holidays, we examine the idea of getting closer to Hashem. This process is known as repentance. With 613 commandments, any number of which where we may not have reached our potential, how do we focus?

Any number of ways exist to divide and subdivide the mitzvot. Some obligations are between man and Hashem, like Shabbat or prayer, while others are between man and his fellow man, like laws against stealing and murder. Some mitzvot are positive, such as honoring parents, while others are negative, such as not bearing false witness.

All human beings are individuals in many ways, and our relationship with Hashem is one. No two people have the same challenges. Some wrestle with kashrut, while others battle the urge to gossip.

When it comes to repentance, therefore, there is no one correct path. Every individual has his own unique way to pursue to become closer to the Creator. The goals, however, should be small and reachable. Developing that ultimate relationship with G-d is a lifetime goal, not meant to be achieved in one season or one year. Work on one thing at a time. Accomplish that and move on. Meeting the challenges one at a time will allow for more and continued success.

May this year of 5776 bring us all to closer relationships with the Almighty, and in turn closer to the ultimate redemption.

In closing, listen for the shofar. Let it fill your heart and open you up to the New Year 5776 and Congregation Etz Chayim.






School. Everyone is invited to participate.


