SHOIN TZEIT — 'TIS THE SEASON

December is often a tricky time of year for many of us. Maybe during December our ability to be tolerant of others is being tested. At times it is difficult to tolerate the influx of holiday culture that is not our own. It comes at us from every corner as we move through the month of December. I like to think that others amplify our Chanukah lights unknowingly during this time of year.

Following Chanukah and the month of Kislev comes the month of Tevet. <u>The 10th of Tevet</u> is a fast day because we are asked to remember, take pause in our routine to acknowledge a horrible event in Jewish history in hopes of preventing it in the future. What happened 2,500 years ago in 588 BCE? Nebuchadnezzar began his assault on Jerusalem. Many scholars note that this event marks the beginning of the end of the first Temple built by King Solomon. It took only a few years, for the Babylonians to breach the city and ultimately destroy the first temple.

If it is true that our lesson to be learned from the ultimate destruction of the Temple was founded in the fact that Jews of that time were slipping into a routine that lead to assimilation, then we can find comfort that we are doing the right things at our shul with programming geared toward Jewish education and living a full Jewish life. THE PROGRAMMING PAGE

Rabbi Yaakov Lasson

When lighting the Neirot Chanukah, the Halacha of "Kavta, Ain Zakuk La" is at play. This Halacha, law, teaches that once you have prepared enough oil to burn for at least a half-hour or so (in a secure location), you do not have to relight the Menorah if the candles are extinguished in the interim. The Talmudic discussions about this particular rule are both fascinating and thorough.

In this context, though, I would like to share one thought regarding the symbolism of this rule. When things don't go well in life, we may justifiably feel angst and frustration. If we accept the fact that God plays a key role in our lives, though, we can learn to let go. Confident that we put our best foot forward in whatever endeavor we are involved with, we can then wait peacefully and see what happens. If it works out, wonderful, thank God. If the endeavor is unsuccessful, realize that all is not lost. God is our partner in every life endeavor, sacred or mundane. Success or failure is ultimately in His Hands.

"Kavta, Ain Zakuk La" - If the candles go out by accident, do not despair. You prepared well for the moment; the lights went out on their own accord. It simply was not meant to be. Perseverance is an excellent trait, but sometimes we have to accept what happened and move on to the next step in our lives - like the candles going out. There is no need to relight; what has happened has happened.

Rabbi Joseph B. Soloveitchik, of Blessed Memory, of Yeshiva University, famously discusses this dual nature in Man: First man strives for confidence and creativity as he "wishes to conquers their world". That is us lighting the candles. But the second element of Man is his "surrender to God", his acceptance of whatever happens. That is the flame flickering out. Ultimately, God only asks of us the basics and the rest is up to Him. All is in the Hands of Heaven, except for the Fear of Heaven. (Talmud Bavli, Brachot 33b). We do our best and leave the rest to God. May we merit the final redemption very soon. Kayla and I wish all a Chanukah Sameach!

At the 7 day post-wedding celebration ("sheva brachos") for a bride and groom, we invite new faces to the nightly festivities - so as to continuously cheer up the new couple.






