FROM THE RABBI

I Get By With a Little Help From My Friends



Now we are in the middle of the Three Weeks leading up to Tisha B'Av, which commemorates the destruction of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. The Rabbis tell us that Hashem allowed the destruction to happen because we were guilty of baseless hatred. They also warn that only by correcting our misdeed can the Temple be rebuilt.

In the time of Rome there was much division among the Jews. Hatred was rampant. The Talmud tells the story of Kamtza and Bar Kamtza, where one man's dislike for another was so great that it helped to facilitate the destruction.

This summer I have had the pleasure of seeing the remedy to this. During my illness the outpouring of love and support has been overwhelming. From the shul itself, to all of its members, to so many others throughout the community, the sentiments have been tangible. It makes recovery that much easier. These are the actions that will bring the redemption.

May we see the Beit Hamikdash rebuilt speedily in our days.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Summer Home and Some Are Not

Well here we are. It's Summertime and livin' is easy. That's where we left off in the June/July Hashomer.

<u>"Summertime"</u> is an <u>aria</u> composed in 1934 by <u>George Gershwin</u> for the 1935 <u>opera Porgy and Bess</u>. The lyrics are by <u>DuBose Heyward</u>, the author of the novel <u>Porgy</u> on which the opera was based, although the song is also co-credited to <u>Ira Gershwin</u> by <u>ASCAP</u>. ^[1] If you choose to read more about this and the origins of the music you too will discover that our heritage permeates the history of almost everything.



In August through history, I found many seemingly unrelated Jewish events. People of prominent impact were born and died and in some instances murdered. That is a sad but common occurrence of Jews throughout history. Discoveries were made. Peace was declared and freedoms were granted. The Declaration of the rights of Man and of the Citizen (French: Déclaration des droits de l'homme et du citoyen) was passed by France's National Constituent Assembly in August 1789. To us as Jews, it was from this important document that Jews were granted religious freedom in France. That religious freedom did not really exist during the time of the first or second Temple.

We observe Tisha B'Av this month as we mourn the destruction of the Temples. We long to return to our homeland. We do observe the event with deep introspective prayers. We try to fill the hole left by the losses sustained and we cannot move on, after more than two thousand years.

Understanding Tisha B'av is complex and complicated. It appears to some that we are stuck mourning the loss and not moving on from it. We are not seeking to understand and accept the loss of a loved one. We are seeking to replace things that were taken from us. We keep our hope alive. We don't forget what we had. We remember it. We pass it on from generation to generation. The Temple belongs to us and if and when we all return to Jerusalem, hopefully we live to see the Temple rebuilt.

This month we are rebuilding an idea that will enlarge the Jewish experience for our children at Etz Chayim. Our children and those from Congregation B'nai Israel will join together at the David S. Stone Religious School. We are doing this to provide a larger Jewish social environment for learning. It's not a Temple but a bigger brighter place for our children to learn more about our history. They will learn how, where and why Jews year after year and generation after generation continue their faith.

Thanks to the many people at Etz Chayim and Congregation B'nai Israel for seeing the need and working towards the common goal for our children.


