FROM THE RABBI

Are the Holidays Late This Year?



As a result of the fact that 5776 is a Jewish leap year, all of the fall holidays occur in October this year. In other words, the perception is that the holidays are "late." The reality, however, is that they are neither early nor late, but rather right on time.

The Jewish calendar is based on the cycle of the moon. A lunar year is approximately ten days shorter than a solar year. Without adjustment this would cause the holidays to wander throughout the seasons. The halacha, however, does not allow this.

The holiday of Sukkot celebrates the fall harvest. As a result it must occur in the fall. Without a leap year this year Sukkot would occur about September 17, before the autumnal equinox. This scenario is not permitted.

When the Jewish calendar was fixed in the fourth century of the common era, the nineteen year cycle was made with seven leap years, in which we add a thirty day month. Because of this the holidays always fall in their proper time. I wish you all productive use of the extra time to prepare for our "late" fall holidays




