FROM THE RABBI

Shabbat Shekalim Time to Remember Your Shul

Every year, on the Shabbat beginning or immediately preceding the month in which Purim falls, we read the portion of Shekalim. In this section the Israelites are given the command to collect a half shekel of silver from every male twenty years and older. These donations served a number of purposes. The silver from the first years donation went to making the sockets for the Mishkan, the travelling tabernacle in the desert. Donations in subsequent years went to upkeep of the Mishkan as well as purchasing the needs for communal sacrifices. Additionally, these fund were used to take a yearly census.





Even without the Beit Hamikdash there still is a custom to give a half shekel before Purim. We use half the monetary unit of the country, or in our case, a half dollar. We give three as the word donation is found in the section three times. Many synagogues use the time of Shabbat Shekalim as an opportunity to request funds from their members. The original commandment was essentially the first synagogue appeal.

There is never a bad time to give money to the shul, but this time of year additionally connects us to the Beit Hamikdash, which we pray daily will be rebuilt soon. May our donations this year indeed bring us closer to that event.


