FROM THE RABBI

DON'T TAKE ANYTHING FOR GRANTED



At Mincha preceding Yom Kippur we recite the full confession, as we do a total of eight times on Yom Kippur itself. If Yom Kippur is the day to which these prayers truly apply, why are they said at this service? The Rabbis answer this question by stating that just in case a mishap should occur at the meal preceding the fast, and a person, G-d forbid, does not make it to Yom Kippur, at least he made a full confession once.

Human beings are creatures of habit. As such, we become used to the things that we do and depend on those things always being there. The Rabbis in

many instances caution us against such an outlook, reminding us to always take the first opportunity to accomplish a task. The next chance, even if scheduled and planned for, may not be there.

Repentance is something we should never "wait" to do. While the forty days leading up to Yom Kippur, and especially Yom Kippur itself, are days reserved for such behavior, we should always train ourselves to try and become closer to Hashem. We should find a way to do this monthly, weekly, or even daily if possible. With this outlook we should never lose the chance to atone for our misdeeds, thus finding favor in G-d's eyes.

May we all be inscribed and sealed in the Book of Life for 5778.




Explanations of the Tashlich ceremony will be given. There will be games for the children and traditional treats will be served.




