

## SUSAN HARTMAN MUSKA TO RECEIVE THE 2017 MORRIS LUBITSKY MEMORIAL AWARD



Congregation Etz Chayim is proud to announce Susan Hartman Muska as this year's recipient of the coveted Morris Lubitsky Memorial Award for 2017.

The Morris Lubitsky Award was adopted by the Etz Chayim Board of Directors following the death of Morris Lubitsky in 1976. Included among the guidelines are the following: *The nominees must have displayed continuous effort and devotion throughout their years as members of the synagogue, past and present. The nominees must be members who have exemplified themselves in outstanding work for the community, both Jewish and general.* 

Susan Hartman Muska, honored with the Morris Lubitsky Award this year, has distinguished herself in many ways, in a variety of arenas, through her numerous areas of expertise and a multitude of passions.

Born and raised in Toledo, Susan was educated around the country and around the world and, with Nick, her husband of more than 50 years, chose Toledo as the place to settle, raise their son Sam, enjoy life with each other and Sam's wife Mindy, and hold onto the family connections which always have been and continue to be of great importance in her life.

Susan's education, her professional life, and her years of volunteerism, have been rich and diverse. After earning her undergraduate degree from Antioch College, she earned her Master of Arts from the University of California in Santa Barbara at which she was also a Ph.D. Candidate, majoring in French literature and linguistics. She studied in France and Mexico and taught in France as well as in this country. Susan received her Law Degree from the University of Toledo in 1977 and has been an attorney in Toledo since then. She began her career focusing on client-landlord issues and served as a Magistrate in the Housing Division of Toledo Municipal Court for 18 years. For the past twenty years, she has been in private practice, concentrating on creditor's rights and collection matters.

At Congregation Etz Chayim, Susan brings her world view, broad experiences, deep intellect, and ever-ready sense of humor into discussions at board meetings and committee meetings. Regardless of the office she holds or the committee in which she is participating, she is a faithful supporter of all programming. As a life-long learner, she immerses herself in every educational opportunity, not only at our shul, but throughout the Jewish community, in fact, throughout her world. She takes every commitment seriously with follow-through that is impeccable, respected by all who work with her; best of all, she routinely greets each day, each person, each issue with a smile, focusing on opportunities and brainstorming to find solutions. Her loyalty to Congregation Etz Chayim, our history and our future, make her a unique and treasured member of the Etz Chayim family.

In the Toledo community at large, "Downtown Toledo" is one of Susan's passions. She had a hand in saving the Gardner Building from the wrecking ball, as well as LaSalle & Koch's Department Store, and was the attorney for "Friends of the Valentine", the initial group to save the Valentine from being demolished. Susan was the attorney to help form the Toledo Warehouse District Association and is proud to have moved her office to the Warehouse District six years ago, which she refers to as the "happening-est" part of town. In fact, not only is she a member of the Toledo Warehouse District Association, she is also a tour guide at the annual "Wander the Warehouse District" event showcasing redevelopment of the Neighborhood. Additionally, besides being an avid Mudhens fan since 1948, Susan and Nick have been season ticket holders since the Hens moved downtown 14 years ago. Susan is also a supporter/fund raiser for the Toledo School for the Arts; and she is involved in supporting jazz in our community, raising money for scholarships for jazz vocal students to assist with their training. And the list goes on and on.

On his own, you may see him at any hospital, rehab center, or nursing home, where he goes to pay a visit, to bring cheer, to show that he cares, greeting someone who is ill, performing with the greatest humility *G'milut Chasadim*, Acts of Loving Kindness.

Harry has been an active and vital part of Congregation Etz Chayim for many years. He has held many positions on the Board of Trustees as well as in the Men's Club. He has been a faithful supporter of morning *minyanim* and has supported every synagogue organization as needs have arisen. He has long been a member of the House Committee and is always helpful at the Sisterhood's Annual Rummage Sale. Harry is also always present to help in the office with a variety of tasks, doing whatever he is able that needs to be done.

In past years, Harry was actively involved in the Goldstein-Goodman VFW Post 6909. He volunteered at the Darlington House and he has always participated in and supported the community's UJA fundraising campaign. Harry is a former president of Sanger Library Branch Friends of the Library and is a member of the Old Newsboy's Goodfellow Association. And most of us remember with pride running into Harry at the Toledo Museum of Art, at which he served as a Gallery Guard.

What do you enjoy doing? We have many exciting activities lined up for November! Join us!



### DAVID S. STONE RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

The school year is well under way and all of the students at David S. Stone Religious School are involved in many exciting learning opportunities.



Our preschool teacher Morah Megan writes: We have been very busy in their classroom for the first few weeks of the year. We are working on learning all about the Jewish holidays, as well as mitzvahs and tzedakah, and are just about to begin the aleph bet. Our classroom time consists of

music, art, play, games, and getting to know each other. We have fun and learn and the time just flies by. If you have any questions about what is happening in our room, please feel free to contact me at svandyke@ameritech.net.

Peter Silverman's class has started studying the history of Israel from Abraham through World War I. They'll next go from World War I to the present. They look at maps for eac stage in history to see how borders change. Every class they'll be discussing the current situation in Israel and the Middle East so that the students are able to discuss it intelligently and to understand the geography.

They have also discussed Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur, and Sukkot. For Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur they went through exercises on who the students have hurt, who has hurt them and what it really means to repent and, even harder, change. They spent a lot of time talking about relationships with parents, and each student was encouraged to not only apologize for any hurt they caused, but to talk through with parents what steps each could take to limit friction points. For Sukkot, they discussed what it means to be happy as the commandment is to be happy all seven days. They tried to think through the difference between superficial, temporary happiness and a deeper happiness that can carry us through life, and how Judaism is all about that deeper happiness.




