#### FROM THE RABBI

#### What Difference Does an Hour Make?

Sixty minutes. A relatively small block of time. Seemingly insignificant in the big picture. Over the years, however, I have learned just how important one small hour is.

Purim begins this year on the evening of Wednesday, March 20. The date is significantly later than last year, as this year, 5779, is a leap year. Additionally, because of the schedule of daylight savings time, this year the times are an hour later than last year when Purim fell during standard time. The Megillah is not supposed to be read until nightfall. Unfortunately, that means we will begin the reading at approximately 8:30 p.m.

I promise you that nobody is more frustrated by the late time we experience here in the spring and summer than I am. I recognize just how inconvenient this is, especially given that Shacharit is earlier the following morning, beginning at 7:00 a.m. to accommodate the daytime Megillah reading. Nevertheless, we need to follow the law.

Despite the late hour, I hope you will be able to join us for Purim evening services, as well as the following day. The Rabbis tell us that the reward for observing any mitzvah is increased by the circumstances we must overcome to do so.

A happy and joyous Purim to all.
