

# FROM THE RABBI

# SHABBAT AND TISHA B'AV - A STARK CONTRAST



Tisha B'Av is considered to be the classic day of Jewish tragedy. From the sin of the spies in the desert, to the destruction of both Holy Temples, to the expulsion from Spain, and beyond, this is the day that has been marked to commemorate the misfortunes of our people. As a result, we use this day to fast, sit on the floor like mourners, and lament.



This year Tisha B'Av falls on Shabbat. On Shabbat we eat meat, drink wine, and celebrate the day Hashem rested after creating the world. Public mourning is forbidden on Shabbat. Even someone in the midst of Shiva (the seven-day mourning period after burial of a close relative) ceases public mourning practices and celebrates Shabbat.

When the calendar works out as it does this year the day of fasting and mourning is pushed off until Sunday. We celebrate Shabbat as we would any other week of the year. The only exception is that we cease eating at sunset.

With the commemoration of Tisha B'Av being pushed off for Shabbat, we pray that, in fact, the restrictions of the day be pushed off permanently with the arrival of Messiah and the rebuilding of the Temple speedily in our days.

# FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

Having been born and raised in Toledo, I have always known what a wonderful city it is and what a great Jewish community we have.

Marrying a native Toledoan, Allen and I loved living here and having our family and friends close by. One doesn't realize the value of close family and friends until a significant event occurs in your life.

Over the past two years since Allen was diagnosed with the devastating disease of ALS, our Toledo friends have been at our side with constant love and support. Visits, phone calls, meals and grocery shopping are just a few of the many mitzvot people have provided. Family and friends traveled distances to visit us and recount stories and experiences we shared in the past.

But nothing can compare to the outpouring of love and support that our synagogue family and the Toledo Jewish community has given to honor Allen's memory. One of Allen's final requests was to have *Shomrim* (guardians) to be with him following his death and prior to the burial. When he passed away at 9:13 p.m. on Monday, July 8<sup>th</sup>, I did not think that anyone would be available to be with him at such a late hour with such short notice. But I was told that so many people volunteered that over the course of approximately forty hours, he was never alone at any moment.

Allen loved Toledo and most especially he loved Etz Chayim. No matter what synagogue or service we attended when we were out of town, he couldn't wait to get back to the people and services he loved at "his" shul.

As his disease progressed, his biggest regret and what saddened him the most was his inability to be part of the daily minyan and be on the bima for Shabbat services.

I cannot fully express how grateful I am to everyone who honored Allen's life with all the love, support and mitzvot. This is truly a remarkable community.

# Remembering our Gabbi, Allen Leveton

Several weeks ago, Congregation Etz Chayim lost a good friend, as well as an honored Gabbi, when Allen Leveton passed away after a long fight with ALS. It is my honor to remember him.

I have been told that as a 15 year old, Allen tutored me at the time of my Bar Mitzvah. Although I don't remember that specifically, I have seen over the years not only the importance he placed on Judaism, but also the depth of his commitment to living a Jewish life.

Allen attended services daily and through the years his observance and beliefs grew. In his 40's, he assumed the responsibility of Gabbi, learning his skills under the tutelage of Abe Greenberg, of blessed memory. Allen retained this cherished role for some thirty plus years. From his seat on the bimah, it was with pride and energy that Allen helped make sure that the synagogue services ran smoothly and correctly. When he called you up to the bimah for an Aliyah, he smiled and welcomed you. I, personally, shall not forget when he would call me up, pinch my check and kiss my forehead, adorned with his unforgettable grin. It was always my pleasure to be there with him at my side.

At every opportunity, Allen made a point of reminding all men that they too should help to make a minyan. At Board meetings, he repeatedly became impassioned as he pleaded for all men to fulfill this responsibility. It was simply of the utmost importance to him.

Additionally, among few others, Allen was a master of Toledo Jewish genealogy. He not only knew everyone, he knew their parents and grandparents, where they lived, school they attended, and did what for a living. His memory was amazing. If you wanted to know about your own family, he was the historian who knew.

Allen could be gruff on the outside, but he was gentle on the inside. His Elsa, our Elsa, was the center of his universe, and it was she who guided him daily, without fail, through every minute of this terrible disease. His children, Sara (Chris) and Jay (Amy) and their children all helped him and Elsa with their love and respect and devotion. Shul and family . . . family and shul . . . Allen's priorities.

Etz Chayim was blessed to have Allen Leveton serve as a Board member and as our Gabbi. We will miss our dear friend. We will miss what he did for the synagogue. We will miss interacting with him and asking him questions that he always had an answer for. We will miss the security of knowing he was there with an impressive depth of knowledge, with his ear to ear grin, and I, personally, will miss his pinch and his kiss.

Your chair is now empty, dear Allen, dear friend, but your legacy remains. We will miss you. We will speak of you. And we pray that your beautiful, beloved soul will rest in eternal peace.

# TISHA B'AV

Tisha B'Av, the Fast of the Ninth of Av, is a day of mourning to commemorate the many trageies that have befallen the Jewish people, many of which have occurred on the ninth of Av. Tisha B'Av means "the ninth (day) of Av". It occurs in July or August.

Although this holiday is primarily meant to commemorate the destruction of the Temple, it is appropriate to consider on this day the many other tragedies of the Jewish people, many of which occurred on this day, most notably the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and from England in 1290.



Tisha B'Av is the culmination of a three week period of increasing mourning, beginning with the fast of the 17th of Tammuz, which commemorates the first breach in the walls of Jerusalem, before the First Temple was destroyed. During this three week period, weddings and other parties are not permitted, and people refrain from cutting their hair. From the first to the ninth of Av, it is customary to refrain from eating meat or drinking wine (except on the Shabbat) and from wearing new clothing.

The restrictions on Tisha B'Av are similar to those on Yom Kippur; to refrain from eating and drinking (even water); washing, bathing, shaving or wearing cosmetics; wearing leather shoes; engaging in sexual relations; and studying Torah. Work in the ordinary sense of the work (rather than the Shabbat sense) is also restricted. People who are ill need not fast on this day. Many of the traditional mourning practices are observed: people refrain from smiles, laughter and idle conversation, and sit on low stools.


In the synagogue, the book of Lamentations is read and mourning prayers are recited. Tisha B'Av is never observed on Shabbat. If the 9th of Av falls on a Saturday, the fast is postponed until the 10th of Av.

# **CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY RESULTS**

In order to have a basis for recommendations to the Etz Chayim Board on the future of Congregation Etz Chayim, the Long Range Planning Committee surveyed the Shul membership in November/December 2018. This survey gave our members the opportunity to have input into those recommendations. This is a summary of the survey results.

#### **Background**

The survey was built at the request of the Etz Chayim Long Range Planning Committee. The goal of the survey was to document and to describe the needs and views of the congregation toward the mission of the Shul. The survey was not intended to be a demographic survey, nor was it intended to replace a full-blown interview-based data collection. The survey was prepared by Drs. Kenneth Pargament and Laura Leventhal. It was distributed by mail to all members, rather than member units, of the Shul, by the Shul office staff. Congregants also had the opportunity to answer the survey by email. The mail version was accompanied by a letter from Shul president, Bob Berkowitz, to explain the purpose and mechanics of the survey. The survey was distributed around 11/15/2018 and data were collected up through around 12/10/2018.

#### Completed surveys

Shul members received the survey by mail. We received 87 responses that were included in the analyses. There were two more surveys that were received during the week of 12/17/2018 and were not included. Finally, there was one additional response that was received orally and was not included. The data from the survey were coded by Alan Jaffee.

<u>Survey</u> The survey consisted of seven quantitative questions and four qualitative questions.

#### Data analyses

Dr. Leventhal performed several detailed statistical analyses on the various responses separately and together.

#### Summary of survey responses

1) Participation: There appear to be two distinct groups of participants: frequent attender and very infrequent attenders.

2) Observance: Many members practice some Jewish observances, such as lighting candles and saying Kiddush on Shabbat, but a much smaller number participate in practices that are a central part of Orthodoxy, namely keeping kosher and not driving on Shabbat.

3) Branch of Judaism: The two most common responses were "Modern Orthodox" and "Conservative".

4) Ranking of most important services offered by the Shul: The rankings in order of importance were Religious, Cemetery, Social and Education. This result is somewhat surprising, given that one could characterize many of our Shul services as incorporating an educational element, even during religious services.

5) Commitment: 84% of respondents are willing to make a commitment to at least one of the offered choices, i.e. Attending Shabbat services at least monthly; Attending minyanim at least weekly; Attending social activities; Attending synagogue educational activities; Serving as a leader on committees and/or the Board; Serving as a member of committees and/or the Board; Inviting Jewish friends to participate in Etz Chayim activities; Participating in Etz Chayim organizations (Men's Club, Sisterhood, chavurah).

6) Increase in types of activities: For this guestion, it is noteworthy that 74% of the respondents identified one or more actions that they would like to see in the Shul. Given the high level of support for items, such as English, easier melodies, interesting sermons and classes, we suggest that the leadership of the Shul give serious consideration to these ideas.

7) Membership option should the Shul close: The majority of respondents indicated that they would join Congregation B'nai Israel or Chabad. It is noteworthy that ten respondents indicated that they would join more than one synagogue.

8) Mission of the synagogue: As a group, participants generally emphasized the mission of maintaining modern Orthodoxy in Toledo.

### Summary

Ninety members of the Shul responded to the survey, indicating a high level of interest and concern for the Shul. Many of the comments were both positive and instructive. In general, in terms of actionable items, respondents supported several changes, most of which were directed at promoting greater inclusion. For example, many respondents favored the incorporation of easier melodies. greater opportunities for congregant participation and more English in our services. Comments indicate that the greater levels of inclusion were not intended to devalue our traditions. Rather, our members who responded do value our role in maintaining Orthodox Judaism in our community.

Additionally, the Shul appears to be made up of members of two groups, those who self-identify as Modern Orthodox and those who self-identify as Conservative. While the reasons for these distinctions in self-identification are not totally clear, having these two self-identified groups does provide a way to better understand them. Both groups participate in Jewish practice. Both groups have similar patterns of Shul participation. Relative to commitment to being involved, both groups show similar patterns as well. In general, the Modern Orthodox respondents appear to be satisfied with Shul practice, while the Conservative respondents supported several actionable items. Should the Shul close, the self-identified Modern Orthodox respondents are likely to participate with Chabad and the self-identified Conservative respondents are likely to join Congregation B'nai Israel.

As the Shul charts its path forward, it is important to recognize that it is likely that these two groups happily co-exist within the Shul because their patterns of practice and identified valuation of the Shul are similar. It will be of great benefit to all to be responsive to the priorities indicated on the survey, as much as possible, to perpetuate that spirit of partnership and community among our members.


