

2019 HARRY LEVINE SERVICE AWARD



Harry Levine was a man among men. His legacy? He was kind. He was thoughtful. He had a wry sense of humor. According to his daughter Barbara, he continued to beat her at gin rummy even at the end of his life. Harry was a successful business man and he and his beloved Frieda raised three daughters in whom they imbued a strong sense of Yiddishkeit that included a strong sense of community. Harry not only was generous to his community, he was generous quietly. He never sought or even liked recognition. He did

what needed to be done just because it needed to be done. One of Harry's greatest legacies at Congregation Etz Chayim was his *single-person minyan phone committee*. Every single night, Harry called the men of the congregation, not stopping until he had the commitment he needed to insure a minyan the next day. And the next evening, he made the calls again. . . and again . . . and again. Week in, and year out, that was Harry Levine, the mensch in whose honor and memory this award was established.

This year, the Etz Chayim Awards Committee unanimously selected the following three individuals to receive this prestigious award: **Naomi Baron, Bob Berkowitz, and Aileen Pargament**. They all are former Morris Lubitsky Award Winners. They all have long been officers of the shul. But the reason they were selected was not because of that. It was because, like Harry Levine, day in and day out, these three people are at shul, doing what needs to be done. No horns blow, no red carpet is laid out. In fact, it is now simply assumed that these volunteers will be there. Why? Because there is work to be done and someone needs to do it. Why? Why not!

We are proud to honor Naomi Baron, Bob Berkowitz, and Aileen Pargament.

Naomi Baron is a former social worker and retired CPA/Attorney. Prior to retiring, Naomi's hobby was to earn graduate level degrees. Since retiring, her activities include bowling, playing mah jong, spending time with her husband Richard, and travelling to Indianapolis to visit daughter Rebecca, son-in-law Darshan, and infant grandson Rahm. In addition, one of her most important activities (holding Rahm being THE most important activity) is volunteering in the Etz Chayim office where she types up the monthly Hashomer, helps to fold and prepare it for mailing, and lends a hand with just about any other office task that needs to be done.

Naomi and Richard have been members of Congregation Etz Chayim since moving to Toledo in 1985. The synagogue became a very important part of their lives from the beginning. Naomi volunteered in the office in the early nineties, became First Vice-President for Finance in 1995 and was elected the first female President of the synagogue in 1997. She has repeated her role as Finance Vice-President a couple of times since then and is a former recipient of both the Morris Lubitsky Memorial Award and the Harry Levine Service Award. Naomi was also active in the Toledo Jewish Cemetery Association as an Etz Chayim representative and took a significant role protecting the synagogue's interests during the transition of the cemetery and the Etz Chayim Perpetual Care Fund to the Toledo Jewish Community Foundation.

Naomi is grateful for the loving support she receives from Richard in every endeavor. She is also grateful to Elsa Leveton and Sandy Marcus for their dedication to Etz Chayim, and to the Harry Levine Service Award Committee for believing that her work lives up to the legacy of Harry Levine.

She strongly encourages every member of the Etz Chayim community to become involved in volunteer opportunities at the synagogue so that they, too, may discover that Etz Chayim is more than a synagogue, it is a family!

Bob Berkowitz was born and raised in Toledo, where family was a central part of his life. He attended the University of Toledo, where he received his bachelor, master's and administrative degrees. He spent 18 years as an elementary teacher, 20 years as an elementary principal and four years working as an adjunct professor at Lourdes University. Bob was a member of Phi Delta Kappa, recipient of the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation Award, and was selected as the Sylvania Educator of the Year in 2003.

Bob has been actively involved in Congregation Etz Chayim, serving as the Sunday School principal for 5 years and 5 years as its President. He has previously been awarded the Morris Lubitsky Memorial Award as well as the Harry Levine Service Award. His love of Judaism can be seen through his shul participation. Almost daily he may be found volunteering in the synagogue office.

A highlight of Bob's life was working as a referee for high school and junior high football games, a job he held for 38 years, until retiring at age 70. Recently he has reconnected to a game of his past, duplicate bridge, from which he derives great pleasure.

Bob has been married to Cheryl for 44 years and they are the proud parents to Marla and Vicki (Andy) and four fabulous granddaughters, Ruthie, Yael, Izzy and Olivia. Just as when he was a child, family is a central part of his life. He enjoys spending time at the family cottage at nearby Wampler's Lake where he and his siblings enjoy each other, each other's children and each other's grandchildren.

Bob would like to thank the committee for selecting him as an awardee of the Harry Levine Service Award.

Aileen Pargament was born and raised in Baltimore, MD, where she grew up in a close-knit family and community. She attended the University of Maryland from which she earned her undergraduate degree, as well as her MSW. It was also at college that she met Ken, her husband of 45 years.

In 1979, Aileen and Kenny moved to the Midwest where Ken joined the faculty at BGSU and Aileen worked for the Wood County Mental Health Clinic as a clinical social worker. When they moved from BG to Sylvania, they chose to join Congregation Etz Chayim, drawn by the warmth of the people and the feeling of being welcomed into a family. They have always felt that Etz Chayim was their second family and have wanted to help the synagogue flourish. Aileen has played a leadership role in the synagogue, holding the offices of Vice-President of Finance and of Personnel, as well as President, and was a recipient of the Morris Lubitsky Memorial Award.

In 1983 Aileen started her private practice in Toledo, seeing individuals, couples, and families. She retired in July, 2017.

Aileen and Ken have two grown sons, Jonathan (Laura), and Ben (Amanda). Of course, their pride and joy are their grandchildren, Emmy and Oliver.

Since retiring, Aileen and Ken have traveled widely. They most recently returned from a trip to Africa, and have traveled extensively in this country as well as internationally. They enjoy learning about other cultures and experiencing the sights, sounds, and rhythms of other places. When Aileen is not volunteering at Etz Chayim, Red Cross or Hospice of Northwest Ohio, she enjoys spending time with friends and family, baking and cooking, reading, taking walks, playing mahjong, and especially needlepoint.

Aileen is very grateful for the opportunity to be part of the Etz Chayim family. She especially appreciates the honor of receiving the Harry Levine Service Award. She feels so blessed to have such a rewarding life, especially her wonderful family, friends, and synagogue.


INTRAFAITH BLOOD DRIVE PLANNED
