The recipes will be emailed to all participants to try at home. If this activity is successful, as we anticipate it will be, recipe sharing and conversation will become a monthly event.

SISTERHOOD SOUP RECIPES

SQUASH SOUP Suzie Rosenberg

- 1 large butternut squash, peeled, seeded & cubed (about 8 cups)
- 2 T. extra virgin olive oil
- 1 medium yellow onion, diced
- 4-5 stalks celerv. diced
- 1-2 garlic cloves, minced

1-2 tsp. minced ginger

- 1/4 tsp. turmeric
- 1/2 tsp. ground sage
- 1/2 tsp. basil
- 1/2 tsp. rosemary, crushed
- 1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg

Saute the onions, celery and garlic in olive oil until soft and translucent. Add the spices. Add the squash and brown slightly, stirring often. Add 32 oz. of vegetable broth and enough water to completely cover the squash. Bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to a slow simmer. Cover and simmer until squash is fork tender (15-25 minutes). Allow the mixture to cool enough so that you can comfortably transfer it in batches into a blender (or use an immersion blender in your soup pot). Blend until very smooth. Add 2-1/2 cups of unsweetened coconut milk to the soup. Reheat as needed.

LEEK & POTATO SOUP Margie Siegel

8 leeks, white & light green parts only (maybe 6-8)

- 1 stick butter or margarine
- 4 medium potatoes, peeled & finely diced
- 1 carrot, thinly sliced
- 4 c. chicken broth, heated (or pareve substitute)
- 1 quart water, heated
- 1 c. milk or milk substitute; or an extra cup of chicken broth
- 1 tsp. salt & 1/8 tsp. white pepper, chopped parsley

Cut leeks in half lengthwise, and then crosswise into 1 inch pieces. Simmer gently in butter or margarine for 10 minutes. Add potatoes, carrots, broth and water. Season with salt & pepper. Cook over low heat to simmer for 40 minutes or until potatoes can be mashed against the side of pan.

Let cool slightly and put through processor to puree or use an immersion blender. Return to stove & stir in milk (or milk substitute or additional chicken broth). Adjust seasonings & garnish with parsley.

MUSHROOM BARLEY SOUP Phyllis Wittenberg

10 c. vegetable or chicken stock1 1/2 pounds sliced mushrooms1 T. olive oil2 medium onions, peeled & chopped

8 carrots, peeled & chopped 5 ribs celery, chopped 1 c. barley, uncooked salt & pepper

In a large soup pot, over medium heat, add the olive oil and onions. Saute for 2 minutes. Increase the heat to medium-high. Add the sliced mushrooms and cover. The mushrooms will sweat out their liquid after 5-7 minutes. Stir occasionally until they are cooked through. Add the carrots and celery. Add the stock and bring to a boil. Add the barley, stirring occasionally. The barley will take approximately 45 minutes to cook. It should be soft, but not mushy. Season to taste with salt and pepper.



The Notorious RBG, being exhibited at the Illinois Holocaust Museum & Education Center in Skokie, is an exploration of Justice Ginsburg's life. The docent-led tour tells Ginsburg's story using videos, photographs and documents, historical artifacts, and contemporary art.

According to the Illinois Holocaust Museum website: "Based on the New York Times bestselling book and Tumblr page of the same name, *Notorious RBG: The Life and Times of Ruth Bader Ginsburg* is the first-ever museum exhibition focused solely on this judicial icon, whose image graces mugs, t-shirts, posters, and bobbleheads. The exhibit is a vibrant exploration of Justice Ginsburg's life and her numerous, often simultaneous roles as a student, wife, mother, lawyer, judge, women's rights pioneer, and Internet phenomenon. Whether you're a fan or a legal scholar, don't miss this blockbuster exhibit!

"This exhibition was developed by Associate Curator at Los Angeles Skirball Cultural Center, Cate Thurston, in partnership with Irin Carmon and Shana Knizhnik, co-authors of the *New York Times* bestselling book, *Notorious RBG: The Life and Times of Ruth Bader Ginsburg*.

"Briefs and other writings by RBG, including some of her famously searing dissents, are woven throughout the exhibit. In keeping with the spirit of Carmon and Knizhnik's book, the exhibition riffs off the playful connection between Notorious RBG and rapper Notorious B.I.G. The name of each gallery section alludes to a song or lyric from the late hip-hop artist."

Registration and a \$10 General Admission fee is required. The date for a virtual tour is Wednesday, November 18 at 11:30 a.m. Each person interested in the program should visit the Illinois Holocaust Museum events page at https://www.ilholocaustmuseum.org/pages/programs/events/ to find the specific listing, register and pay the \$10 fee. Registered participants will receive the link from the museum about 24 hours before the tour begins.
