ETZ CHAYIM SISTERHOOD TU B'SHEVAT RECIPES

ROSEMARY & SPICE NUTS Aileen Pargament

1 1/2 tsp ground cumin

1/4 tsp cayenne pepper

1 T sugar

1 tsp salt:

2 1/2 c. nuts2 T olive oil1 1/2 T chopped fresh rosemary1 tsp black pepper

Preheat oven to 300 degrees.

Pour oil into a small saucepan over medium-low heat until warm. Add rosemary & stir until mixture is aromatic, about 1 minute.


Pour flavored oil over nuts. Add all other ingredients and stir to coat evenly.

Put nuts onto baking sheet. Bake, stirring occasionally, until nuts are toasted (about 20-30 minutes.)

Remove from oven and cool completely on wax paper on top of regular paper until cool. The nuts can be stored at room temperature in an airtight container for 4 days.

<u>AUNT JOSEY'S APPLE CAKE</u> <u>Cheryl Berkowitz (via Margie Siegel)</u>

5 large apples, pared and diced 5 tsp sugar 2 1/2 c. sugar 4 large eggs 1/2 tsp salt 1 T baking powder 2 tsp cinnamon
3 c. of flour (Softasilk by Gold Medal)
1 c. oil
2 tsp vanilla
1/4 c. orange juice
1/2 c. chopped walnuts (optional)



Bake at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours or until a toothpick comes out clean.

BRANDIED APRICOT JAM Carol Van Zile

2 c. dried apricot halves (about 10 ounces), each cut in two2 1/2 c. water1 3/4 c. sugarJuice and grated peel of 1 orange1/2 tsp almond extract3 T brandy or Cognac1/2 tsp almond extract



Combine the apricots and water in a bowl and let stand overnight or until soft and well plumped, about 8-12 hours.

Combine the apricots and their water in a saucepan with the orange peel and juice. Simmer for 5 minutes.

Add the sugar and bring to a boil, stirring. Boil gently, stirring often, until the mixture is thick and shiny and begins to clear the sides of the pan when stirred. Add the almond extract and brandy or Cognac. While the mixture thickens, be sure to stir it continually but gently, so the fruit does not burn or get squashed. This process should take roughly 25-30 minutes.

Ladle the mixture into jars.

Cool and let mellow several weeks or more before serving. We like it right away but the flavors change slightly with age.

TU B'SHEVAT



Tu B'Shevat gets its name from the date on which the holiday occurs, the 15th of the month of Shevat. A minor Jewish holiday, it is often referred to as the new year (or "birthday") of the trees. The holiday originated in the Talmud, and was based on the date chosen for calculating the agricultural cycle of taking tithes from the produce of the trees, which were brought as first-fruit offerings to the Temple in Jerusalem.

The holiday of Tu B'Shevat fell out of practice after the destruction of the Second Temple, but was revived by kabbalists in the Middle Ages. They instituted the practice of a Tu B'Shevat seder, a meal that partly mirrors the Passover seder and involves eating biblical foods native to the Holy Land and drinking four cups of wine.

Tu B'Shevat has developed into an ecological holiday that reminds Jews of our connection to the earth and to our role as caretakers of the environment. Some modern practices include donating money to plant trees in Israel or planting trees locally.






