

THE HARRY LEVINE SERVICE AWARD

Above and Beyond Over the Top . . . Just Like Harry

Above and Beyond . . . Over the Top . . . Harry Levine, of Blessed Memory, was a leader among leaders of our shul. He gave of his time, his resources, and was the backbone of our daily minyanim. A role model to be emulated, Harry carried with him warmth, wit, commitment to Jewish continuity, and humility which was matched only by his generosity.

Steve Marcus and Melvin Siegel, yes they are - both of them - above and beyond and over the top - in their dedication, loyalty, and contribution to Congregation Etz Chayim. Chosen unanimously by the Morris Lubitsky Memorial Committee, they are the recipients of this year's Harry Levine Service Award.

Among other things, Steve has been the president of Congregation Etz Chayim multiple times, each time for multiple years, as well as longtime chair of the Trust Oversight Committee. Among other things, Melvin has been longtime chair of the House Committee, taking care of the inside and outside of our building, as well as handling the responsibilities of High Holiday Aliyot. Both men have held multiple positions of leadership on the Etz Chayim Executive Board, in Netay Etz Chayim, and in the Men's Club. Both have been active minyanaires. Neither has said no when called upon. But even more than saying yes, both have always, consistently, done more than the minimum, always reached for the maximum, always asking what needed to be accomplished and then setting up a plan to get there. Both have been awarded the Morris Lubitsky Memorial Award. Both walk with confidence at our shul and both walk with humility. They exemplify beautifully the admonishment by Micah: Love mercy, do justly, walk humbly with thy G-d.

Steve Marcus was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, and raised in Mansfield where both his mother and father were leaders in the Jewish community. He attended Miami University where he met his wife, Sandy, and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Degree. Sandy and Steve moved to Toledo in 1975 when Steve began his education at the University of Toledo College of Law.

Like many in the community, Steve's initial connection with Congregation Etz Chayim was through Rabbi Garsek who was the mohel at the birth of his first son, Joshua. In 1983, just prior to welcoming Adam to their family, Steve and Sandy joined Congregation Etz Chayim.

Steve is a partner in the law firm of Fell & Marcus Co., LPA, representing injured workers in the State of Ohio relating to workers' compensation. He and Sandy have been married for 46 years and are proud parents and grandparents to both Joshua (Leah) and Adam as well as their fabulous grandchildren, Hanna, Sam, and Jaxon.

Mel Siegel was born and raised in New York in a traditional home. Along with his two sisters, he was given the basis of family and Judaism by his parents. We kindle these lights for the miracles and the wonders, for the redemption and the battles which You performed for our forefathers in those days at this season through Your holy priests. During all eight days of Chanukah these lights are sacred, and we are not permitted to make ordinary use of them, but only to look at them - in order to express thanks and praise to Your great Name, for your miracles, Your wonders, and Your salvations.

Monkey Business, The Adventures of Curious George's Creators Featuring a narrow escape from the Nazis on makeshift bicycles, the documentary, Monkey Business, explores the extraordinary lives of Hans and Margret Rey, the authors of the beloved Curious George children's series that has sold over 75 million books in more than 25 languages, making Curious George the most popular monkey in the world. Originally from Hamburg, Germany, the Reys resided in Paris where they accidentally became children's book authors when a publisher suggested they create a book out of a cartoon Hans had drawn. Being German Jews, however, their life in Paris abruptly came to an end in June 1940 when the Reys were forced to escape from the Nazis by riding makeshift bicycles—a manuscript of the first Curious George book was one of the few possessions they could smuggle out with them. Arriving in New York as refugees, they started their life anew and over the next three decades they created a classic that continues to touch the hearts and minds of children around the world.
