In November we find ourselves moving through the month of Cheshvan. Cheshvan also goes by the alternative name of Mar Cheshvan, meaning bitter Cheshvan. The folklore behind this name is that the month is bitter because it is the only month on the Jewish calendar that is completely devoid of holidays.

But this could not be further from the truth! Come nightfall on November 22, we will be entering into the Holiday of Sigd, a Holy Day observed by the Ethiopian Jewish community for hundreds of years. Sigd commemorates both the acceptance of the Torah by the Jewish people, as well as our continued observance of the Torah even amidst centuries of suffering and persecution.

I invite us to take advantage of the opportunity of this Sigd to think not only on Torah and its role in our lives, but also on how we as a Jewish collective are enriched by our more distant communities such as those in Ethiopia and beyond. When we expand our collective consciousness to include the unique and different ways that Jews do Judaism worldwide, then we will merit richer religious lives and whole months that are sweetened from their previous bitterness!

Don't forget to change your clocks back one hour on Saturday evening, November 5, 2022.

Please note: The current Interment/Perpetual Care charges were incorrect in the October Hashomer. The current Interment/Perpetual Care charge for a single plot is \$2,500 and for a double plot is \$5,000. The increase as of January 1, 2023 is \$230 for a single plot and \$460 for a double plot.

The Toledo Jewish Community Cemetery Association (TJCCA) has recently approved an increase of the Interment/Perpetual Care charge beginning January 1, 2023. As a benefit to our members, we are notifying you of this increase so that you have the opportunity, if you wish, to prepay your burial costs at the current price. Prepaying at the current levels will be available until December 31, 2022.

Burial charges for a single plot:

Interment/Perpetual Care - \$2,500 Increasing to \$2,730 as of January 1, 2023
Shroud - \$200 (No change)
Talis (if applicable) - \$65 (No change)
Memorial Plaque at Congregation Etz Chayim (optional) - \$600 (No change)

Burial charges for a double plot:

Interment/Perpetual Care - \$5,000 Increasing to \$5,460 as of January 1, 2023. (Payable at the first death.)
Shroud - \$200 (No change)
Talis (if applicable) - \$65 (No change)
Memorial Plaque at Congregation Etz Chayim (optional) - \$600 (No change)

As a reminder, if a couple has not prepaid both Interment and Perpetual Care, then if a double monument is chosen at the first spouse's death, the surviving spouse must pay the entire Interment/Perpetual Care fee in effect for a double plot at the time of the deceased spouse's death.

If you have already prepaid all burial costs to Etz Chayim, then none of these changes will affect you. Your family or estate will not be required to pay any future increases at your death. However, if you have prepaid only some of the burial costs, then the burial cost that has not been prepaid will be assessed at the then current charges.
