FROM THE PRESIDENT

As I write this message, I am looking forward to this week's Fireside Chat with Rivka Fridman and to a Shabbat weekend with Rabbi Jason Mark, including a Chinese Dinner on Friday night and Shabbat morning services. As you read this message, I hope that both events are a memory in which you were able to participate. It is true that many of our members are not able to participate in all activities, but there are many to choose from, each an opportunity to pray with, play with, or simply interact with our shul family. IF you are able, we hope you will join us.

We are pleased that some events draw members of the broader Jewish community into our synagogue. In fact, as our community dwindles in size across the board, it is lovely that all the congregations are encouraging shared learning and social activities. Please make sure that you read the Toledo Jewish News and the Friday Facts to become aware of the many opportunities in our community.

One such opportunity is Technology with Tim Hagen of the Federation. Many of us struggle with tech problems regularly. In addition to the programs sponsored by the Federation, Tim is available to come to your home for a one-on-one if you are in need.

Our Future Committee continues to explore options. None have yet been eliminated by us. Currently, we are working with the Federation in the exploration of the Five Lakes Church on McCord Road, as a possible Federation Community Center, in which Etz Chayim would carve out space to hold services, social events, and conduct the business of the synagogue. We are working with an architectural firm to analyze the space. If the board makes any recommendations about moving our congregation to another space, a Congregational Meeting will be held for approval.

There is a myriad of programs already planned for February and March, including Tu B'Shevat learning with our esteemed teacher, Aviva Panush, a Super Bowl Party at the home of Joe Wittenberg, a group outing to watch and hear the Toledo Opera's South Pacific performance, and a zoom book discussion and art tour with Naomi Baron and Andrea Delman. Thank you to the Program Committee, led by our programming director, Nancy Jacobson, for such enticing variety!

Finally, I am happy to tell you that we have received a grant from the Federation to help with the cost of our security. This grant is a direct result of the LiveSecure Campaign, a campaign in which the entire community is involved. The funds are being matched and are being used to help keep our entire Jewish community safe. Simply put, when you come to shul, the salary of the person who opens the door for you is partially paid through these funds. If you have not already contributed, I hope you will consider doing so.

And best of all, our Wednesday Minyan continues to meet successfully, often exceeding ten men. Please know that if you need a minyan for a yahrtzeit, you may request it, and these dedicated minyanaires will do what they can to make it happen. They are the backbone of how Etz Chayim continues to function!

Celebrate Tu b'Shevat by planting a tree in Israel or supporting their desalination program. Stay warm, stary safe, stay well, stay active.


