FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Congregant,

Two parties, hearing the exact same words, walked away with totally contradictory understandings . . . yes, we have all seen it happen. It can result in a huge headache but doesn't have to. If people are willing to listen, to listen openly, to problem solve together, energy can be used to find good solutions.

This kind of situation strikes me particularly at this time of the year because it is precisely when we look to resolve conflicts, conflicts with people, with friends, colleagues, family members. It is a time when we are looking to start with a clean slate. We ask forgiveness . . . and we forgive.

We are fortunate to be able to make choices. We are fortunate to be able to understand that anger and grudges and self-righteousness use a lot of energy that could be used in a positive way, bringing joy to others or to ourselves, in efforts to repair the world, *tikun olam*, or provide acts of loving kindness in our community, *gemilut chasidim*.

We end one year, 5785, and begin 5786, concurrently with my term as president of our shul. People ask me how it is going, knowing that this is a time in our congregational life when tough decisions are being made. My answer, consistently, is that although it is a big responsibility to be the president of the shul, it is my pleasure, actually, a privilege, because I am working with a group of board members and staff who all care as much as I do, who are open to ideas, to discourse, always with respect for each other. We choose to work together, using our energy to seek solutions for the issues we face.

Rabbi Sacks, of blessed memory, in recounting the chaos over the Golden Calf, said that Moses knew that to build a team, the team had to have a purpose, and so he asked each of the Israelites to contribute to the building of the Tabernacle. And the chaos subsided; they worked together on a common purpose. The lesson: *Get them to undertake a task that they can only achieve together, that none can do alone.*

Thank G-d our board and staff have long been a team, long worked together. But it is important and worthwhile to note that not only together, but individually, each adds so much to our common purpose, each with his or her creativity, intellect, resourcefulness, specific skills, dedication, vantage point and even humor. What a group. To each of you and all of you, *yasher koach*. I know that none of you, nor I, can do this alone. But together, we can achieve. May you be blessed with good health and strength, please G-d, as we move forward, eyes open, to continue our work to preserve and perpetuate our beloved Congregation Etz Chayim.
