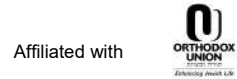

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Congregant,

Australia for Pesach . . . what's different? What's the same? Face Israel towards the Northwest. We pray towards the East. Pray for dew, even though beginning winter in Australia, because prayer is for dew in Israel, not for Australia. We pray for dew also, even as we enter a very rainy season, because we are praying for dew in Israel. We begin counting the Omer wherever we are, exactly the same. And we pray in Hebrew, wherever we are, exactly the same.

Change of place . . .

Central City Philadelphia, which Rabbi Eliezer Hirsch used as an example of a place where it is hard to get foods that are kosher for Passover . . . are you kidding me? Perhaps people who live in large Jewish communities could relate to that but for those of us in Toledo, or other similarly sized Jewish communities, anywhere in the Philadelphia area sounds very close to the availability of Passover goods.

Some people love Pesach; others not so much.

Everything is relative. Everything does depend on personal experience and resultant perspective. It is with these many perspectives in mind, that the Etz Chayim Board of Trustees is exploring our reality, and will make decisions about our future.

What is real, no matter perspective, is that our congregation continues to shrink, that our members desire and deserve rabbinic leadership, and that our building is much larger than we need.

Our Future Committee, under the leadership of Steve Marcus, continues to examine every option, and every opportunity, before making a recommendation to the board regarding our future. After we know, you will know.

In the meantime, please be assured that we have confirmed plans with Rabbi Jason Mark and Joseph Gold to lead us in services as we welcome the year 5787, please G-d, this coming September. We will face East, toward Israel. We will pray in Hebrew. And we, like our brothers and sisters in Australia and in Central City, Philadelphia, will listen to the shofar as it sings out, "Tekiah, Shevarim, and Teruah . . . next year in Jerusalem."

SHAVUOT

Shavuot



It is ironic that Shavuot is such a little-known holiday, given that it commemorates the single most important event in Jewish history – the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai.

Shavuot occurs on the 6th of Sivan, the culmination of a seven-week period, "counting of the Omer," that occurs following Passover. The very name "Shavuot" means "weeks," in recognition of the weeks of preparation and anticipation leading up to the Sinai experience.

Since Shavuot occurs 50 days after the first day of Passover, it is sometimes known as "Pentecost," a Greek word meaning "the holiday of 50 days."

(Shavuot, however, has no connection to the Christian Pentecost holiday.)

Three millennia ago, after leaving Egypt on a day of Passover, the Jews traveled into the Sinai desert. There, the entire Jewish nation – 3 million men, women and children – directly experienced divine revelation:

G-d spoke to you from the midst of the fire; you were hearing the sound of words, but you were not seeing a form, only a sound. He told you of His covenant, instructing you to keep the Ten Commandments, and He inscribed them on two stone tablets. (Deut. 4:12-13)

The giving of the Torah was an event of awesome proportions that indelibly stamped the Jewish nation with a unique character, faith and destiny. And in the 3,300 years since, the Torah's ideals – monotheism, justice, responsibility – have become the moral basis for Western civilization. In the words of U.S. President Calvin Coolidge, "The Hebraic mortars cemented the foundations of American democracy."

Shavuot this year begins at sundown on Thursday, May 21st and ends at nightfall on Saturday, May 23rd.

Etz Chayim Book Club Announcement

Following a very stimulating and fun initial meeting of the Congregation Etz Chayim Book Club, our second Book Club meeting will take place on Sunday, June 7th at 10:00 a.m. The location will be announced in the next bulletin.

Margie Siegel will lead the discussion about a wonderful book, Elephant Company, by Vicki Croke. Here's a brief description of the book:

The remarkable story of James Howard "Billy" Williams, whose uncanny rapport with the world's largest land animals transformed him from a carefree young man into the charismatic war hero known as Elephant Bill.

Elephant Company is also a tale of war and daring. When Japanese forces invaded Burma in 1942, Williams joined the elite British Force 136 and operated behind enemy lines. His war elephants carried supplies, helped build bridges, and transported the sick and elderly over treacherous mountain terrain. As the occupying authorities put a price on his head, Williams and his elephants faced their most perilous test.

Elephant Company, cornered by the enemy, attempted a desperate escape: a risky trek over the mountainous border to India, with a bedraggled group of refugees in tow. Part biography, part war epic, and part an education about the remarkable elephant,

Elephant Company is an inspirational narrative that illuminates a little-known chapter in the annals of wartime heroism.

The Book Club meets every two months for an hour or so in someone's home to discuss one of a variety of books – classics, modern, novels, non-fiction, biographies, (even banned books), and whatever people might find stimulating and enjoyable. The goal is to share whatever thoughts or feelings we might have about the books, learn from the author, learn from each other, and have a lot of fun in the process! Discussions in the first four meetings are being led by one of the Book Club Committee members (Rachel Osnowitz, Ken Pargament, Margie Siegel, Mel Siegel). The office is also open at other times by appointment.

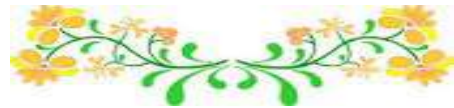
