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Message from the President

Dear Congregant,

We have just commemorated Tisha B'Av, the saddest day on the Jewish calendar. Among the tragedies we remember are the destruction of the First Temple by the Babylonians in 423 BCE and the Second Temple by the Romans in 69 CE; the expulsion of England's Jews in 1290 and of Spain's Jews in 1492.

Interestingly, the earliest date recalled on Tisha B'Av is 1313 BCE, when the spies returned from the Promised Land. You will remember that the report was divided. Ten of the spies reported that the inhabitants were "giants," compared to which the Israelites were like "grasshoppers," and we would be wiped out. Only Caleb and Joshua returned with a favorable report, saying that the Israelites could easily conquer the land with G-d's help.

Recently, I read the following words of Angela Davis. They gave me pause: I am no longer accepting the things I cannot change. I am changing the things I cannot accept. – Angela Davis. These words are an interesting challenge to the thoughts of the Serenity Prayer: G-d, grant me the Serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the Courage to change the things I can, and the Wisdom to know the difference. The difference, of course, is accepting the things we cannot change or not accepting them. It is an interesting thought about the word "can." It is changing the things we cannot change if we are able. It is not simply playing with words; it is challenging ourselves to do more than we think we can.

The majority of the Spies accepted what they thought they could not change. Caleb and Joshua did not. They wanted to challenge the things they could not accept. They wanted to go into the Promised Land and believed that with G-d's help, they would succeed.

The journey we are now traveling in our synagogue has many challenges. Some of us want to accept certain realities because they cannot be changed. Some of us want to challenge what we cannot accept. No one is wrong . . . just different perspectives.

Much appreciation to Steve Marcus, chair of the Future Committee, and to his committee. As directed by our Board of Trustees, together, they are working on evaluating the option of sharing space with Congregation B'nai Israel, while maintaining our identity as Congregation Etz Chayim. Committees have been formed to examine issues regarding the kitchen, the space we would use, and the finances. We hope to move through this process as efficiently and thoroughly as possible.

Not sure what the result will be or what our future holds. Will we relocate? Will we remain where we are? Not sure where our Promised Land is. Ultimately, however, our ancestors did get to the Promised Land. With G-d's help, so shall we.

Looking forward to seeing you at the picnic!

As the generation of Holocaust survivors grows smaller, preserving their stories becomes an ever more urgent responsibility. Whether your connection is personal, historical, or rooted in a commitment to Holocaust remembrance, *Echoes of Vilna* promises to be an inspiring, emotional, and deeply meaningful experience.
